Support programs for indigenous and rural communities.


Volunteering and responsible social tourism.

Why Guanamaque?

In 2024, we launched a pilot project in the Kogui indigenous community of Guanamaque (Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta, Colombia) to promote:



Pilot results (2024-2025)



1. Métodos de baja calidad

Fermentación en sacos y secado en el suelo.

2. Construcción de la planta

Primera planta artesanal de transformación de cacao.

3. Colaboración comunitaria

Trabajo de 8 Voluntarios junto a la comunidad Kogui.

4. Beneficios directos

6.000 kg de cacao seco transformados contra 360kg el año anterior.

Current challenge: more cocoa, capacity at its limit

Thanks to the success of the pilot, more Kogui families have joined the production. However, the current plant cannot cope.

Faced with the limitations, the community took the initiative:





- They divided the three original dryers into two, reusing the lids to create new units.
- They created a giant dryer that can handle a total of 700 kg.
- They are already creating two fermenters of 500 kg each.

This solution reflects the community's ingenuity and commitment, but also highlights the urgent need to expand and improve the plant to ensure quality, hygiene, and sustainability in the process.

Goals 2025-2026

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Sustainable access to water

Implement a self-sustaining community hydraulic system (hydraulic ram technology) that guarantees water for the cocoa process, without relying on external energy or affecting the natural environment.

Support the planting of 8,000 additional cocoa trees

- Balanced among 16 producer farms covering a total area of 1,300 hectares.
- Equipping Kogui workers with shovels, machetes, and saws.
- Providing support with simple meals to encourage community minga days.

Community trade strengthening

- Training in negotiation, product presentation, and connecting with conscious buyers. Evaluation of certifications such as organic or fair trade.
- Promotion of community-led, direct and fair marketing.

Strengthening cultural immersion

- Through foreign volunteer programs
- Communicating about aspects of Kogui culture

Expected impact



More than 50 producer families directly benefited.



Cocoa processing with added value, quality and dignity.



Strengthening indigenous autonomy and cultural immersion.



Generation of fair and sustainable income.
